


Due to the fine weather, Momo felt comfortable lying and rolling on the lawn.


As she was looking up at the Dome of the Rock in the sunlight, some women wearing scarves spoke to her gently.

There were about one hundred meters tall cliffs facing each other.


At the bottom of them, the deep and narrow corridor ran 1.5 kilometers long.

According to them, it seemed to be said that their habits of wearing scarves were the origin of neckties.


Shaking her curly tail, Momo had decided to do one thing.

Momo had decided to look for a restaurant which served potatoes with butter.


But she was worried about one thing.

Then, she visited the Austrian Postal Savings Bank in the district.


Momo came up with an idea to send a post card to Tanya.


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
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
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
