



When Daibutsu-den (the building for Daibutsu) came into her sight, she gradually recalled the hugeness of the statue.


Momo was thrilled and imagined one thing.



Quite timely, Momo could see the statue of Asura this time.


Asura-san had three faces and six arms.





It was so comfortably warm that Momo felt asleep before she knew that ...



At the time, she was spoken to from somewhere.


"Hey, Momo-chan! Come here!"

The Tosho-gu was located right next to the Rinno-ji.


The buildings of the shrine were unbelievably gorgeous.







She also heard some cheerful voices of children from somewhere.


An elementary school or a kindergarten might be in the vicinity.

Spoken to by somewhere, Momo looked around and found an old bat hanging from a stone wall.


"This place was once destroyed by war."

Taking a nap in such a beautiful place might have been one of the happiest moments in her life.









The word "sefa" seemed to mean "highest" and "utaki" indicate "sacred place," respectively.


Initially, this had been a place where only women could enter.



It seemed to be the oldest one as the ruins of Gusuku (ancient castles of the Ryukyu Kingdom).


Climbing up the narrow stone stairs, Momo found an overwhelming panorama surrounded by Nakagusuku Bay and Kinwan Bay.



Momo heard that its stone arch gate was the oldest one in this prefecture.


It looked like a tunnel, so it was enjoyable and exciting for her to get through it. Momo repeated it over and over again.





"Bow (wow)! Can I walk on there? It must be fun!"


Climbing up the ladder, Momo skipped around.
